THE DANGER OF BONES TO PETS

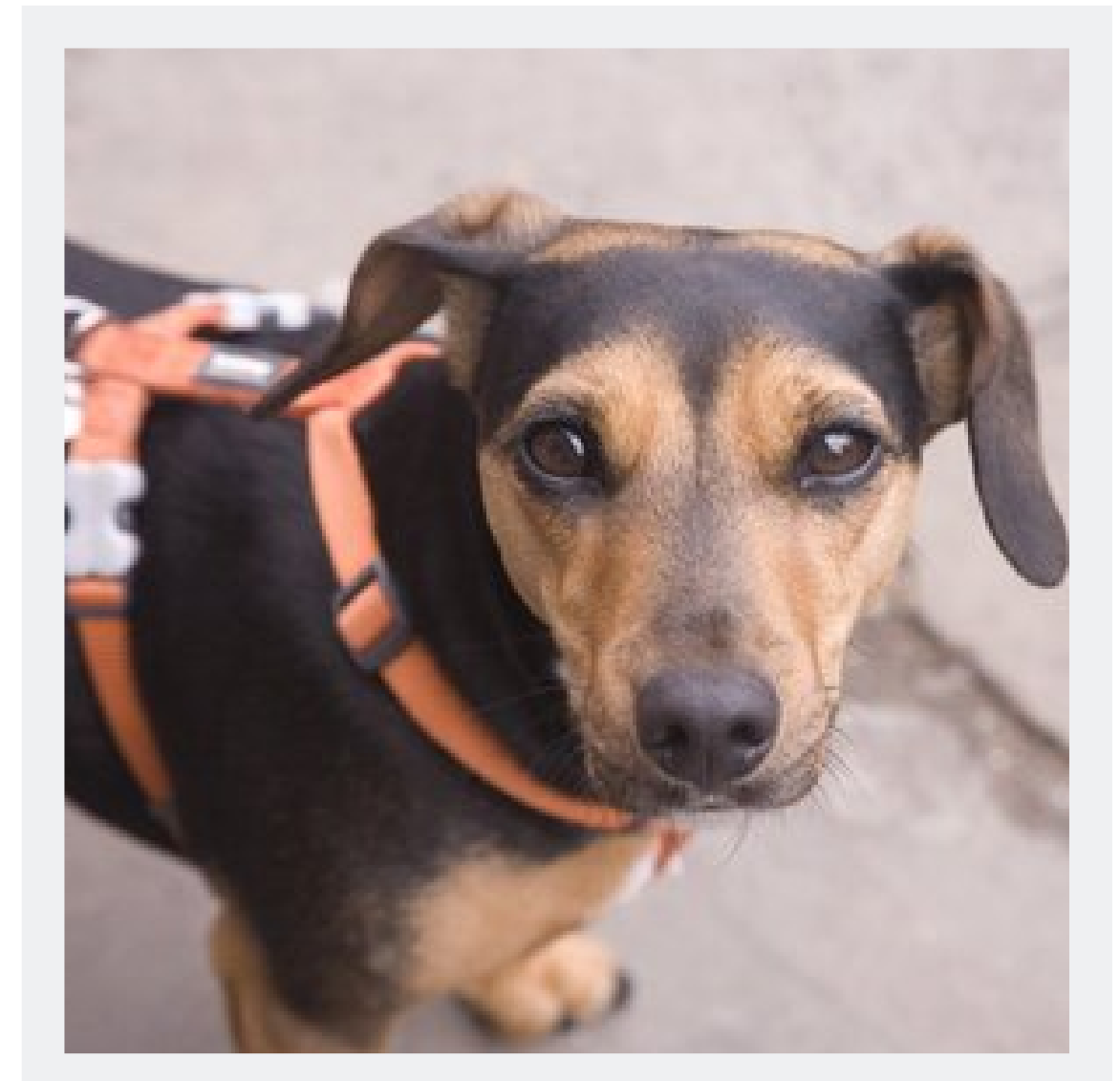

CHRISTMAS DANGERS FOR DOGS

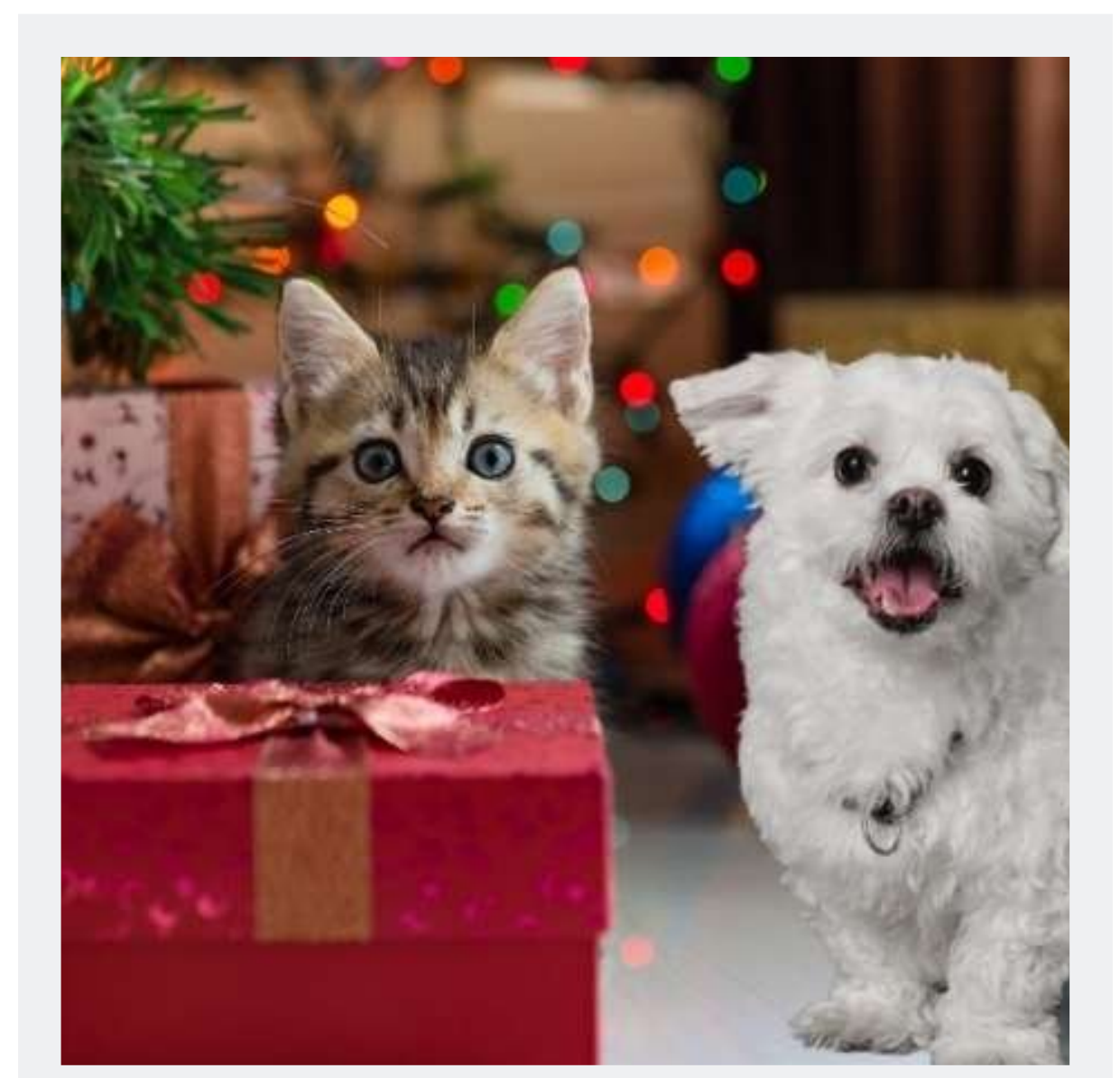
