It's also important to wash their feet and dry them after every walk, as they could be licking substances from their fur and paws and ingesting it in this way. If you do have any concerns, please don't hesitate to get in touch with us.


Don't forget to come and see us if you have any concerns about your pet coping during the fireworks season.



#### LET'S TALK ABOUT RABIES



#### LET'S TALK ABOUT PYOMETRA


