Just a reminder to keep up to date with your pet's flea, tick and worm treatment. We have recently seen a few animals with fleas. This often happens when we start turning on our central heating. If your pets are not treated properly, they can very quickly get a heavy flea burden and become unwell, as well as establish part of their life cycle in your home. It is a myth that these creatures only survive in the summer. Due to new prescription laws, if you have not been in since the start of September, you will need to see a vet for a free consult to prescribe the flea, tick and worming treatment.

We are pleased to report that our dental promotion month, where we offered 10% off dental treatment, was very busy. We pride ourselves in gold standard dental care. We offer free dental checks for your pets, so don't hesitate to give us a call should you think your pet might have poor dental health. Signs of poor dental health include bad breath, rubbing of face, eating on one side, and salivation, amongst others. If in doubt, get them checked.






WHY WE ARE PASSIONATE ABOUT YOUR PET'S DENTAL HEALTH






TEAM UPDATE:


